Not only does it require significant training for the church planters themselves, but it requires a team of support missionaries, consultants and churches. This session is designed to help you see what it takes to be prepared to reach the unreached. 

# GETTING STARTED

## Session Introduction:

Once missionaries learn the language and culture of an unreached people group, what happens next? This session explains strategies for teaching and translating God's Word. When a church is born, the new believers need discipleship to grow in their understanding and spiritual life. Eventually, a maturing church will have its own leaders, will be discipling their people and will be sending out their own missionaries.
